

Dear Mr. Pae and All Insurance Company Decision-Makers,

Our firm represents Cash Settlemann ("Mr. Settlemann" or "our client") regarding an incident on January 26, 2024, involving James Greene ("Mr. Greene" or "your insured").

We are prepared to resolve our client's claims and submit the enclosed information and documentation in good faith to avoid the cost and time of formal litigation. Under Fla. Stat. § 90.408, the enclosed materials are for settlement purposes only and cannot be used at trial unless obtained through legal proceedings. Please provide a list of any additional items needed to evaluate this settlement demand within 30 days of this letter.

Mr. Settlemann sustained significant injuries in the collision on January 26, 2024. The immediate impact resulted in significant cervical, lumbar, shoulder, and knee injuries. These injuries have led to persistent pain and functional limitations that have substantially impacted Mr. Settlemann's life. In the aftermath of the collision, Mr. Settlemann experienced substantial limitations in his daily activities. Simple tasks such as bending, lifting, and ambulation, which were previously effortless, now cause considerable pain and discomfort. This has directly affected Mr. Settlemann's capacity to maintain his normal daily routine and independence. Further, the harm to Mr. Settlemann's professional life has been particularly significant. His

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injuries have impacted his productivity and ability to fulfill his professional responsibilities. The ongoing pain and the demands of treatment have necessitated modifications to his work duties.

Beyond professional challenges, Mr. Settlemann's recreational activities have also been significantly 0ed. Activities that once provided him joy are now limited due to his physical restrictions. The collision has also placed a strain on his family relationships. The limitations imposed by his injuries have altered his ability to participate in family activities and fulfill his usual roles within the family dynamic. Additionally, Mr. Settlemann's injuries have limited his social life and made it difficult to participate in his community.

As a result of the January 26, 2024, collision, Mr. Settlemann has endured months of medical treatment, and he continues to require ongoing care to manage pain and enhance function. The persistent pain, limitations, and medical treatments have led to emotional distress, and medical evidence suggests that long-term limitations and related challenges are likely to persist into the foreseeable future.

1.FACTS

On January 26, 2024, Mr. Settlemann was the restrained driver of a vehicle traveling eastbound on West Hallandale Beach Boulevard in Hallandale Beach, Broward County, Florida. At the same time, the defendant was the driver of a vehicle also traveling eastbound on West Hallandale Beach Boulevard. Suddenly and without warning, the defendant negligently changed lanes without yielding, directly entering Mr. Settlemann's path and causing a collision. Upon impact, Mr. Settlemann's body was violently jostled about the interior of the vehicle, and his right knee hit the dashboard. The collision resulted in Mr. Settlemann sustaining significant personal injuries and other damages.

2.LIABILITY

As exposed in the Traffic Crash Report, Officer R. Acosta of the Pembroke Park Police Department investigated the collision and determined that Mr. Greene was the sole party responsible for the collision due to his failure to perform a proper lane change. Furthermore, Mr. Greene was cited for improper lane change (Citation Number AJIPYNE).

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The conditions for establishing liability in this case are clear. Mr. Greene owed a duty of care to the other drivers on the road. Florida law requires that all vehicles must be driven as nearly as practicable entirely within a single lane and must not be moved from that lane until the driver has first ascertained that the movement can be made with safety. Fla. Stat. Ann. §§ 316.081, 316.089. On the date of loss, Mr. Greene lacked attentiveness and all due care, improperly changed lanes, and failed to take reasonable evasive action to avoid the collision. As a result of Mr. Greene's acts and/or omissions on January 26, 2024, Mr. Settlemann suffered significant personal injuries and damages for which Mr. Greene is undoubtedly liable.

3.INJURIES AND TREATMENTS

On January 26, 2024, Mr. Settlemann's life was significantly impacted when Mr. Greene's negligent actions caused him serious injuries, including a partial tear of his right rotator cuff with bicipital tendinitis, a labral tear of the right shoulder, and complex tears of the medial and lateral meniscus in his right knee. The trauma required an emergency department evaluation on January 26, 2024, followed by a series of outpatient consultations, diagnostic imaging, a cervical epidural steroid injection, and a structured program of physical therapy.

Mr. Settlemann's injuries have severely limited his ability to perform his physically demanding job, forcing him to avoid strenuous labor and routine activities involving prolonged standing and heavy lifting. The injuries have resulted in chronic shoulder and knee pain, as well as a limited range of motion that continues to impede Mr. Settlemann's daily functioning. Mr. Settlemann's medical team anticipates ongoing treatments, including physical therapy, pain management interventions, and potential surgery.

3.2.Interventional Treatments

Cervical Epidural Steroid Injection at C6-C7

Date of Service: May 7, 2024Provider: Dr. Joseph Rabi

 Description: The procedure involved a cervical epidural steroid injection at the C6-C7 level, using fluoroscopic needle guidance. Mr. Settlemann was sedated with MAC (Monitored Anesthesia Care); the procedure was performed to address cervical radiculopathy, and the medication injected included 2 mL of normal saline and 1 mL of Kenalog 40 mg.

• (Referral) Right Knee High Tibial Osteotomy

o Referral Date: May 3, 2024

o Provider: Dr. Gregory Markarian

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 Description: This is a recommended treatment for Mr. Settlemann's right knee pain and dysfunction. The procedure would involve surgery to realign the knee joint.

• (Referral) Right Shoulder Arthroscopy with Rotator Cuff Repair and Labral Repair

o Referral Date: May 3, 2024

o Provider: Dr. Gregory Markarian

 Description: This is a recommended treatment for Mr. Settlemann's right shoulder pain and dysfunction. The procedure would involve arthroscopic surgery to repair the rotator cuff and labrum.

3.3. Objective Tests

MRI Cervical Spine

o Date of Service: March 1, 2024

o Provider: American Diagnostic MRI

Findings: Moderate spinal canal stenosis and mild spinal cord compression at C3/C4 and C5/C6, multilevel neural foraminal narrowing, severe bilaterally at C3/C4 and C6/C7, and severe on the right at C5/C6

MRI Lumbar Spine

o Date of Service: March 1, 2024

Provider: American Diagnostic MRI

• Findings: Multilevel neural foraminal narrowing, severe bilaterally at L4/L5 and L5/S1, large 5-6 mm osteophyte disc complexes abutting both descending L5 and S1 nerve roots in the lateral recesses

MRI Right Knee

O Date of Service: March 4, 2024

o Provider: American Diagnostic MRI

Findings: Anterior cruciate ligament fibers not identified normally, mild-to-moderate sprain of the PCL and lateral collateral ligamentous complex, diffuse maceration/complex tear in the lateral meniscus, complex tear in the posterior horn and posterior root insertion of the medial meniscus

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• MRI Right Shoulder

Date of Service: March 5, 2024Provider: American Diagnostic MRI

 Findings: Low-grade partial tear of the supraspinatus tendon, moderate-grade partial tear of the infraspinatus tendon, moderate-grade partial tear of the subscapularis tendon, SLAP tear extending to the posterior labrum, posterior ganglion cyst

• X-ray Right Knee

Date of Service: April 24, 2024Provider: Sports Medicine Institute

 Findings: Minimal narrowing of the medial and lateral compartments with osteophytic spurring, loose bodies within the posterior capsule, severe narrowing with osteophytic spurring in the lateral compartment

• X-ray Right Shoulder

Date of Service: April 24, 2024Provider: Sports Medicine Institute

• Findings: Slight narrowing with osteophytic spurring at the acromioclavicular articulation
